Summary of Sports Grant spending 2016/17

Objectives in spending Sports Grant:

- Increase the level of challenge for pupils in PE lessons
- Increase the range of extra-curricular physical activities available
- Increase children's awareness of issues relating to Healthy Lifestyles

Summary of spending and actions taken:

Spending was allocated to the following actions:

- Additional PE equipment to enable the Real PE scheme to be implemented successfully
 - Time was made available in school to enable Mr Brierley to trial the Real PE scheme in all year groups; and then to team-teach with colleagues to roll out the scheme.
- Life Education caravan
 - All children attended sessions which covered health education issues such as keeping fit and eating well, substance abuse, and dealing with peer pressure.
- Year 3 swimming lessons
 - It was decided to transfer swimming lessons from Year 3 to Year 5. In the interim period, Year 5 lessons were funded from the school budget, whilst Year 3 lessons were funded from the Sports grant.
- Year 3, 4 & 5 Outdoor Education visits introduced all children to a variety of sports which might spark interest in those not currently engaged by traditional sports.

Impact on pupils:

- The quality of teaching in PE improved as a result of implementing last year's Real PE training supported by Mr Brierley's in-house coaching. The level of individual activity within lessons has increased, in some cases quite considerably. The focus on achieving a particular standard has made children more aware of the current capabilities and inspired them to move to higher levels.
- All children in Year 3 can now swim. This has increased their water safety awareness as well as their swimming skills.
