Summary of Sports Grant spending 2017/18

Objectives in spending Sports Grant:

- the engagement of all pupils in regular physical activity – kick-starting healthy active lifestyles
- increased confidence, knowledge and skills of all staff in teaching PE and sport
- broader experience of a range of sports and activities offered to all pupils
- increased participation in competitive sport

Summary of spending and actions taken:

Spending was allocated to the following actions:

- Employing qualified coaches to work alongside teachers in lessons to increase their subject knowledge and confidence in PE
- Providing places for pupils in after-school sport and fitness clubs
- Employing a local coach to provide weekly after-school sports on the school site
- Paying for pool hire and instruction to provide additional swimming lessons for children in Year 5.
- Providing extra, additional activities such as outdoor and adventurous activities
- Training for staff – PE Leader training; outdoor education
- Improving adventure playground and playground markings

Impact on pupils:

- Children have been given the chance to take part in a wider range of sports and fitness events including drumming and fencing.
- We have been able to upgrade the fixed equipment in the school yard that is ready to be fitted once the yard has been recovered. This will enable pupils to practice core skills at playtime and dinner times.
- New markings on the playground will encourage children to take part in fitness based activities in their own free time.
- We ran a Girls' Football Club, with 14 girls attending regularly. This enabled us to form our first Girls' football team and participate in competitions. The Girls' were given information regarding local clubs and teams that were advertising for players.
